	Swiss applicants must include a list of publications of the last 5 years (2012-2017) in the pre-proposal submission. This document must be sent separately to leila.fluixa@snf.ch.
	Upon invitation to submit a full proposal, Swiss applicants must include a detailed SNSF budget form . This document must be sent separately to leila.fluixa@snf.ch.
	Submission of the formal proposal at national level will be carried out once the international evaluation is finalized. The Swiss project partner(s) will then be invited by the SNSF to submit the proposal(s).

Overheads	Overheads are not eligible costs as part of the funded projects. Overheads are paid to the research institution (not to the researchers themselves They are calculated on the basis of the research funding acquired by eligible institutions under eligible funding schemes. Contributions are paid in retrospect at a flat rate and is limited to a maximum of 20% of the relevant SNSF grant.
