Eligibility

Eligible Institutions	SRC approved administrating organisations (i.e. Swedish non-profit research performing organisations, e.g. universities, university hospitals, county councils)
Additional requirements	<p>Swedish Applicants must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) have a PhD.2) be affiliated with a SRC approved administrating organisation.3) communicate with the JPND national contact person regarding their intention to participate in the call, before submission of the consortium application. <p>submit a parallel application using SRC's application system Prisma (this applies to all Swedish project leaders participating in the call). The application form in Prisma can be reached from the call text at SRC's website.</p> <p>Swedish applicants may not:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) have an ongoing JPND grant at the start of the funding period2) participate in more than one application for this call (neither as coordinator nor as partner) <p>SRC approves maximum two Swedish partners or one partner and one coordinator per consortium.</p> <p>See full details at the SRC's call web page</p>

<p>Budget restrictions</p>	<p>Minimum sum (all sums are total for 3 years): 1,2 MSEK (approx 115 000 EUR). Maximum sum: 2,5 MSEK (approx 235 000 EUR) per project with 1 Swedish partner. Maximum sum: 3,25 MSEK (approx 305 000 EUR) per project with 2 Swedish partners. If one of the Swedish participants coordinates the consortium, then this applicant may apply for an extra 500 000 SEK (approx. 45 000 EUR) in addition to the maximum sum for partner(s).</p>
<p>Eligible costs</p>	<p>The project grant may be used to fund all types of project-related costs, such as salaries (including your own salary, however no more than corresponding to the person's activity level in the project), running costs (such as consumables, travel including stays at research facilities, publication costs and minor equipment), premises and depreciation costs. Grants may not be used for scholarships. If a doctoral student participates, project funds may not be paid out as salary during teaching or other departmental duties.</p>
