Eligibility

Eligible Institutions	The FWO integrates 2 of its national funding channels within this multilateral framework. The eligibility of institutions and its researchers can be verified in the relevant and respective chosen funding channels regulations, which can be consulted on the FWO website: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• FWO Research Projects (FO; see articles 10-12)• Strategic Basic Research (SBO; see articles 4-8)
Additional requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• ERA-NET participation does not interfere with the 'regular' project submission framework, and is consequently not taken into account for calculating the max. available number of new applications and running projects combined. However, researchers can only participate within 2 different international consortia per call, if they imply different subjects.• Diverging overhead calculations apply for the fundamental funding channel at one hand and the SBO channel on the other, which is explained in the 'budget' section below.• When the Flemish (FWO) (sub)project implies an SBO project the researchers are asked to provide proactively, and before the pre-proposal

	<p>submission deadline, a concise – but to the point – valorisation plan (no fixed format, max. 2 A4-pages), which clarifies i) the valorisation context within Flanders and internationally, and ii) the involved/interested economic and/or societal actors. This document can be sent towards the eragnet@fwo.be email address.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Projects aiming at the development of a spin-off are not eligible in this context. • Projects have a max. 36 months runtime and have to be budgeted accordingly. Automatic no-cost prolongations are not accepted in this framework. • The PI, for each of the participating institutions from Flanders, must hold an appointment that fully covers the duration of the research project.

Budget

Total earmarked national budget	350.000 EUR (including overhead)
Anticipated no. of funded groups	1
Budget restrictions	350.000 EUR per consortium (including overhead)
Eligible costs	<p>The regular project execution costs are eligible, and as such the respective funding channel regulations apply (see links to national rules above for 'FO' and SBO').</p> <p>Both channels are capped at max. 350.000 EUR per project, incl. overhead, which diverges per funding channel though:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FO: a 6% structural overhead should be applied on the project costs. As a practical example, e.g.: the sum of all costs (personnel, consumables, travel, etc.) amounts to 300.000 EUR, then the overhead will amount to 18.000 EUR (6% of 300.000 EUR) and the total requested cost is 318.000 EUR. This total requested cost may never exceed 350.000 EUR. • SBO: The SBO <u>cost model</u> applies. However, in this framework, and following a similar method like the fundamental projects (FO), an overhead rate has to be applied on the project costs. SBO overhead can go up to 17% and is determined by the researchers host institution.
